CAG: SIDDA’S ‘5G’ SCHEMES STRAINING FISCAL HEALTH

The Congress government in Karnataka may be riding the popularity crest of the “guarantee schemes” but the same bouquet of schemes may be dragging down its economy, warned the Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG).

The CAG said implementation of the schemes without rationalising the existing subsidies, would exert pressure on the state’s resources and impact fiscal deficits and debt levels. The CAG report for the year ending on March 31, 2024, which was the first (CAG) report after the Congress government implemented five guarantees -- Gruha Lakshmi, Gruha Jyoti, Anna Bhagya, Shakti and Yuva Nidhi, with a budget provision of Rs 36,538 crore was tabled in the Monsoon Session of the Legislative Assembly.

J&K LG orders dismissal of 2 govt employees over alleged terror links

Jammu and Kashmir Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha on Friday terminated the services of two government employees in the Union Territory over their alleged involvement in terror activities, officials said.

The sacked employees were identified as Siyad Ahmad Khan, an assistant stockman in the Sheep Husbandry Department residing in the Keran area, and Khurshid Ahmad Rather, a school teacher from the Karnah area -- both in north Kashmir’s Kupwara district.

Man held for trying to scale Parl wall

In a security breach, a 20-year-old man attempted to scale a wall of Parliament on Friday morning but was caught by security personnel and handed over to police, officials said.

Identified as Ram Kumar Bind, the man hails from Uttar Pradesh’s Bhadohi and works in a factory in Surat, Gujarat, police said, adding that he appears to be “mentally incoherent”.

“Today at about 5.50 am, one unidentified person approached the Parliament House complex and tried to scale the perimeter wall with the intention to jump inside. However, due to the alertness of the CISF and Delhi Police staff, he was apprehended and handed over to local police for further enquiry,” a Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) official

The CAG pointed out that the “guarantee” schemes accounted for 15% of the revenue expenditure in 2023-24. “While the state’s revenue grew by 1.86% during this period, its expenditure grew by 12.54%. The increase in the growth expenditure was mainly on account of the “guarantee” schemes which was a contributing factor of revenue deficit to the tune of `9271 crore.

The mismatch of receipt and expenditure resulted in the state witnessing revenue deficit after its recovery during 2022-23 from Covid-19,” the CAG noted. Noting that the state fiscal deficit also rose from Rs 46,623 crore in 2022-23 to Rs 65,522 crore in 2023-24, the CAT stated that the state, to finance the “guarantee” schemes and the defi-

cits arising thereof, availed net market borrowing of Rs 63,000 crore, which was Rs 37,000 crore more than the previous year. “This would only increase repayment burden in the near future, along with increase in the interest burden,” the CAG warned. Pointing out that the capital expenditure towards infrastructure dropped by Rs 5,229 crore, the CAG said that this would result in an increase in incomplete projects by 68%. “This compression in gross capital formation may prove to be detrimental to future growth prospectus,” CAG warned. “Three of the “guarantee” schemes -- Gruha Jyoti, Anna Bhagya and Shakti -- were in the form of subsidies. As a result, the state subsidy burden got pushed up to Rs 60,774 crore,” CAG added.

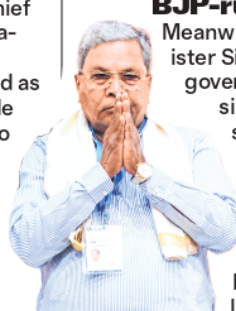
DKS’ rendition of RSS anthem

In a surprising turn of events, Karnataka Deputy Chief Minister D K Shivakumar sang the RSS anthem “Namaste Sada Vatsale Matrubhoomi” during a discussion in the state Assembly. The incident occurred as BJP legislators accused him of inciting a stampede at Chinnaswamy stadium. Shivakumar, who also serves as the Congress state president, was defending his actions after being criticized for waving a flag during an RCB team reception. While the BJP praised the gesture, Congress members remained silent. Following the incident, Shivakumar clarified that he is a “born Congressman” and has no plans to join the BJP or RSS, stating that he was simply knowledgeable about his political opponents.



Sidda recalls 20 stampedes in BJP-ruled states

Meanwhile, Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah defended his government by citing a list of 20 similar tragedies in BJP-ruled states. Reading out examples from Himachal Pradesh, Rajasthan, and Uttar Pradesh, including the 2008 Jodhpur stampede and a 2024 incident in Hathras that claimed 121 lives, the Chief Minister sought to broaden the discussion.



Rising Yamuna poses threat to Taj Mahal as floodwaters engulf Agra’s riverfront

The Yamuna river in Agra swelled dangerously on Friday after heavy rainfall in the hills and the release of large volumes of water from upstream barges, raising fears of flooding that could reach the rear walls of the iconic Taj Mahal.

Officials confirmed that the water level at Water Works had risen to 485.7 feet -- nearly nine inches above the warning mark of 495 feet. With the danger level set at 499 feet, authorities warned that the river could cross the flood mark within the next 24 hours.

Floodwaters have already inundated the protected monument Etmad-ud-Daula, where 12 chambers at the rear side are

submerged. In Tajganj, water has entered the Dussehra Ghat adjacent to the Taj Mahal, and the park behind the monument is waterlogged. If levels continue to rise, officials fear the Yamuna may touch the Taj Mahal’s rear boundary wall. Several other

heritage sites, including Gyarah Sidi, are also under threat.

District Magistrate Arvind Mallappa Bangari conducted an inspection of vulnerable areas and directed relief and rescue measures. “We are on full alert. Boats have been barred on the

Yamuna till August 23. Rescue teams, divers, and disaster response units have been deployed, and heliplanes have been set up for emergencies,” the DM said.

The crisis deepened after 1.78 lakh cuses of water released from Hathinikund barrage on August 17 reached Agra on Thursday, pushing the Yamuna into spate. Water continues to be discharged from Gokul barrage, further adding to the surge.

The rising river has caused massive disruption in low-lying areas. Parvati Ghat in Balkeshwar has gone under water, while cremations at the Tajganj Mokshdham have been severely affected for three days, forcing families to shift last rites to other locations.

GRANDDAD’S IMAGE RIGGED IN BENGAL FILES: KIN

Even as Vivek Agnihotri’s Bengal Files is creating ripples across the nation, Santanu Mukherjee, grandson of Gopal Mukherjee also known as ‘Gopal Pattha’ the main protagonist in the flick, said the image of his grandfather was “dragged down” in the movie.

Fearing that the film might “negate” his grandfather’s character by reading the previews, Santanu confirmed that he has also filed a complaint with the cops against filmmaker Agnihotri.

“My grandfather was a brave heart who had taken up arms to fight against the Muslim League. He walked the path of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose. Our family still believes in Netaji’s teachings. Neither



the filmmaker, nor anyone from the film unit had approached me or my family and sought permission to portray my grandfather’s character in the movie. Several derogatory words have been used too,” Santanu told FP.

Santanu said, “Though I didn’t get a chance to watch the movie, I am aware of a monologue where my grandfather is being referred to as a ‘Kasai’ (butcher). People called

him Gopal Pattha and ‘Pattha’ meant the one who has courage. He (Gopal) had told his followers to fight back only if anyone from the Muslim League killed a Hindu. He had even protected innocent Muslims, women and children of all religions. He provided shelter to several innocent Muslim families. He has been depicted wrongly in the movie.”

Notably, controversy triggered when Agnihotri and his team visited Kolkata for the trailer launch.

Written and directed by Agnihotri, starring Mithun Chakraborty, Anupam Kher, and Pallavi Joshi, the film narrates the horrors of communal violence in Calcutta (now Kolkata) during the Muslim League’s Direct Action Day on August 16, 1946.

His contributions to industry, philanthropy and public service in the UK, and his unwavering support for closer ties with India will always be remembered.” He added, “I fondly recall our many interactions. Condolences to his family and admirers. Om Shanti.” Lord Paul, founder of the UK-based Caparo Group of industries, had been taken ill and hospitalised recently. The House of Lords peer was born in Jalandhar and relocated to the UK in the 1960s for the treatment of his daughter Ambika.

Chief of the Air Staff, Air Chief Marshal A.P. Singh, on Friday underlined the importance of continuous investment in defence and rigorous training for the armed forces, stressing that India’s safety rests on the preparedness of both its military and police forces.

He was addressing students as the chief guest at an event at Maharaja Agrasen College in Delhi.

“Our boundaries - from external and internal threats - remain safe because of the

defence forces and the police. We must not treat this as a burden on the exchequer, but as a necessity. I am very happy that our government has recognised this need and has been regularly acquiring new systems and weapons,” he said.

Highlighting India’s rise in defence capabilities, the Air Chief noted, “Today, we are at par with anybody in the world because of continuous investment. We train with the best in the world, not just to learn, but also to teach.”

He also drew attention to the humanitarian role of the Indian Air Force (IAF).
